- 1. Sixth Street (SR 1310) from Main Street (SR 1142) to US 64.
- 2. Main Street (SR 1142) from a point approximately 625 feet west of Seventh Street to a point approximately 120 feet west of Seventh Street.
- 3. Main Street (SR 1142) from Fourth Street (SR 1155) to SR 1159.
- 4. Seventh Street from Middle Street to Main Street (SR 1142).
- 5. Fourth Street (SR 1155) from Main Street (SR 1142) to the southern corporate limits, approximately 260' south of Middle Street.

Enact 45 mph on the following street:

1. US 64 from SR 1158 to the western corporate limit, approximately 0.34 mile west of Seventh Street.

- (z) <u>Traffic.</u> Pedestrians, ridden or herded animals, vehicles, street cars and other conveyances either singly or together while using any street for purposes of travel.
- (aa) Vehicle. Every device in, upon, or by which any person or property is or may be transported or drawn upon a highway, except devices moved by human power or used exclusively upon stationary rails or tracks; proshall be seemed a vehicle.

ARTICLE II--REQUIRED OBEDIENCE TO TRAFFIG-REGULATIONS AND POLICE OFFICERS

- Section 1. Required Obedience to Traffic Ordinance. It is a midde-meanor for any person to do any act forbidden, or fail to perform any act required, in this Chapter.
- Section 2. Obedience to Police. No person shall willfully fail, or refuse, to comply with any lawful order, or direction, by a police officer.
- Section 3. Authority of Police in Special Cases. In the event of a fire or other emergency, or when necessary to expedite traffic or safeguard pedestrians, police officers may direct traffic as conditions may require, notwithstanding the provisions of this Chapter.
- Section 4. Public Employees to Obey Traffic Regulations. The provisions of this ordinance shall apply to the driver of any vehicle owned by, or used in the service of, the United States Government, this State, County or Town and it Shall be unlawful for any said driver to violate any of the provisions of this Ordinance, except as otherwise permitted in this Ordinance, or by State Statue.
 - Section 5. Exemptions to Authorized Emergency Vehicles.
- (a) The provisions of this Ordinance regulating the operation parking and standing of vehicles shall apply to authorized emergency vehicles, as defined in this Ordinance, except as follows:

A driver when operating such vehicle in any emergency, except when otherwise directed by a police officer, may-

- (1) Park or stand, notwithstanding the provisons of this Ordinance.

 (2) Proceed past a red or stop signal, or stop sign, but only after slowing down as may be necessary for safe operation.
- (3) Exceed the prima facie speed limits so long as he does not endanger life or property.
- (4) Disregard regulations governing direction of movement, or turning in specified directions os long as he doesn't endanger life or property.
 - (b) The foregoing exemptions shall not, however, protect the driver of

any such vehicle from the consequences of his reckless disregard of the safety of others.

Every person propelling my push cart, or riding a bicycle or an animal, upon roadway, and every person driving any animaldram vehicle, shall be subject to the provisions of this Ordinance applicable to the driven of any vehicle except those provisions of this Chapter which, by their very nature, can have no application.

RTICLE III -- OBEDIENCE TO OFFICIAL TLAFFIC CONTROL DIVIGES

Section 1. Obedience to fficial Traffic Control Devices,

- (a) The driver of any vehicle shall obey the directions of any official traflic control device applicable thereto and placed in accordance with the traffic ordinances of this Town, unless otherwise directed by a police officer, subject to the exceptions cranted the driver of an authorized emergency vehicle, in Article II, Section 5, of this Chapter.
- (b) No provision of this Chapter for which signs are required shall be emforced against an alleged violator if, at the time and place of the alleged violation, an official sign is not in proper position and sufficiently legible to an ordinarily observent person. Whenever person shall be effective without signs are required, such thereof.

- Section 5. Flashing Signals. Whenever flashing red or yellow signals are used they shall require obedience by vehicular traffic as
- (a) Flashing red (stop signal). When a red lens in illuminated by repid intermittent flashes, drivers of vehicles shall stop before entering the nearest crosswalk at an intersection, or at a limit line when marked, and the right to proceed shall be subject to the rules applicable after making a stop at a stop sign.

(b) Flashing Yellow (Caution Signal). When a yellow lens is illuminated with rapid intermittent flashes, drivers of vehicles may proceed through the intersection or past such signal only with caution.

ARTICLE IV--STOPPING, STANDING, AND LARKING

Shall stop in any street except for the purpose of parking as prescribed in this Chapter, unless such stop is made necessary by the approach of fire apparatus, by the approach of a funeral or other procession which is given the righ-of-way, by the stopping of a public conveyance, by the lowering of railway gates, by the giving of traffic signals, by the massing of some other vehicle or a pedestriam, or by some emer; ncy; and in any case covered by these exceptions said vehicles shall stop so as not to obstruct any footway, pedestriam aisle, safety some, crossing or street intersection if such can be avoided.

Section 2. Vehicles Not to obstruct Passing of Other Vehicles. No vehicle shall so stand on any street as to interrup, or interfere with, the passage of public conveyances or other vehicles.

Then signs are placed, erected, or installed, givingnotice thereof, or the curbinghas been painted yellow in lieu of such signs, no person shall park a vehicle at any time upon any of the streets in Schedule I, attached to and made a part of this Article.

Section 41 Parking Prohibited During Certain Hours in Designated Places. Section 5. Parking Time Limited to Two Hours In Designated Places. While signs are placed erected, or installed in each block giving notice thereof, no person shall park a vehicle for longer than two hours at except bunday and public holidays, upon any of the streets described in Schedule III, attached to and made a part of this article, and the changing of the position of a vehicle from one point directly to parking period.

Section 6. Parking Time Limited to One Hour in Designated Places. Thereof, no person at all park we will for longer than one hour at my time between the Hours of 6:00 A,M., and 6:30 P.H., of any day; in Schedule IV, attached to and made a part of this article, and the other point, within the same block shall be deemed as one continuous purking period.

In Inforcement Vehicle Stands. Those streets, or parts of streets, described in Schedule VII, attached to and made a part of this Article, shall be reserved as stands for the specific purpose and at the exactlocation named therein and no automobile or other vehicle been designated.

Sect on 9. Parking of Taxicabs Within the Same Block. Not more than two taxicabs owned by the same company, shall be parked in one block at the same time, except such taxicabs as may be parked in established taxi stands as set out in Section 3 of this Article.

Section 10. Parking Rate to urb this Otherwise Directed by this Article, and where the shall park, all vehicles in part parallel of the curb and not more than twelve inches thereton.

Section 11. Vehicles Backed Up to Curb. In no case shall a vehicle remain backed up to curb, except when actually loading or unloading. If the vehicle be horse-drawn, the horse, or horses, shall stand parallel to the curb and face the direction of traffic.

Section 12. Left Side to Curp Not Permitted in Business District No vehicle shall stop with its left side to the curb in the business in the direction of traffic.

- Section 13. Parking Within Lines Where Provided. On any street which is marked off with lines indicating the packing spaces for cars, the same shall be parked between said lines.
- Section 14. Double Diagonal Parking. Double diagonal parking, it an angle of approximately 45 degrees, shall be allowed in the center of Street and
- Section 15. Parking at 45 Degree Angle. Automobiles and other schicles shall be parked at an angle of approximately 45 degrees with the curb on those streets, or parts of streets, described in Schedule VI, attached and made a part of this irticle.
- Section 16. Unlawful Parking. No person shall stand, or park a vehicle upon any street for the principal purposes of:
 - (a) Displaying it for sale.
- (b) Washing, greasing, or repairing such vehicle, except repairs necessitated by an emergency.
- (c) Storage thereof by garages, dealers or other persons when such storage is not incident to the bons-fide use and operation of such automobile or other vehicles.
- (d) Storage of any detached trailer, or van, when the towing unit has been disconnected, or for the purcose of transferring merchandise, or
- freight, from one vehicle to another.

 (e) No vehicle be althoused to park upon any street in town for a period exceeding twenty-four hours at any one destinated spot.
- Section 17. Standing of the les to a mary furpose of dwer. tising Prohibited. No person all a sound of some on any street any vehicles
- for the primary purpose of adversising.

 Section 18. Stopping, Standing, or Parking Prohibited in Specified Places. No person shall stop, stand, or park, a vehicle except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic, or in compliance with the directions of a police officer or traffic control device in any of the following places:
 - (a) On the sidewalk
 - (b) On a crosswalk.
- (c) Within thirty feet of any flashing beacon, stop sign, or traffic control signal located at the side of a street or roadway.
 - (d) Along side or opposite any street excavation or obstruction, when

ich storping, or standing, or parking would obstruct traffic.

- (e) Upon any bridge or other elevated structure or within any underpass structure.
- (f) Within firture feet in either direction of the entrance to a hotel, theatre, hoseital, senatorium, or any public building.
- (g) On the roadway side of any vehicle stopped, standing, or parked at the edge or curl of a streat.

Section 19. Hoving of Vehicles of Other Operators into Bestricted Areas Prohibited. No person shall move a vehicle not owned by such person, into any prohibited area, or sufficiently away from curb to make such distance unlawful.

ARTICLE V -- OPERATION OF WINICLES

Section 1. Stop Before Entering a Through Street.

- (a) Those streets and parts of streets, described in Schedule IX, attached hereto and made a part hereof, are hereby declared to be through streets for the purpose of this Section.
- (b) When stop signs are placed, erected, or installed upon highys intersecting a through street at the entrance thereto, or at the entrance to any intersection, every driver of a vehicle, or street car, shall stop in obedience to such signs before entering the intersection and shall not proceed into, or across, the through street until he has first determined that no conflict with traffic will be involved.
- Section 2. Stop Before Entering Certain Street Intersections. Those intersections described in Schedule X, attached hereto and made a part thereof, are hereby declared to be stop intersections when entered from the streets first named, and when stop signs are placed, erected, or installed at such intersections every driver of a vehicle, or street car, shall stop in obedience to such signs before entering the intersection, and shall not proceed into, or across, the through street until he has first determined that no conflict will be involved.
- Section 3. Stop Then Traffic Obstructed. No driver shall enter an intersection, or marked crosswalk, unless there is sufficient space on the other side of the intersection or crosswalk, to accommodate the vehicle he is operating without obstructing the passage of other vehicles, or pedestrians notwithstanding any traffic control signal indication to proceed.

- Section 4. One-May Streets. Upon those streets, and marts of streets, decarined in Schedula Will, littlebed hereto and made a part hereof, vehicular traffic shall move only in the indicated direction, when simp indicating the firection of traffic are creeted, and maintained, at every intersection where now out in the opposit direction is prolimised.
- Section 5. Driving Through Functal Processions. To vehicle abell be driven through a functal procession, except fire department vehicles, police patrols and advalances, when the same are responding to calls.
- Section 6. Left Turns at Certain Intersections as Indicated. In making left turns at the street intersections described in Schedule XI, attached hereto and made a part hereof, all traffic shall travel to the left of the center of said intersections as may be indicated by buttons, markers, or other directing signs.

Section 7. Ho Right or Left Turns to be Made.

- (a) No vehicle shall make a left turn at any street intersection described in Schodule XII, attached hereto and made a part hereof.
- (b) No vehicle shall make a right turn at any intersection described in Schedule XIII, attached hereto and made a part hereof.
- Section 8. Limitations on Turning Around. No driver shall turn any vehicle so as to proceed in the opposite direction in the business district, except at street intersections, in the streets, or portions of streets, described in Schedule XIV attached hereto and made a part hereof.
- Section 9. Limitations on Backing. The driver of a vehicle shall not back the same into any intersection, or over a crosswalk, and shall not in any event, or at any place, back a vehicle unless such movement can be made in safety, and he shall have given ample warning to those who may be behind, by hand and horn or other signal.
- Section 10. Emerging from Alley or Private Driveway. The driver of a vehicle emerging from an alley, driveway, or building shall stop such vehicle immediately prior to driving onto a sidewalk, or into the sidewalk areas extending across any alleyway, and upon entering the roadway he shall yield the right-of-way to all vehicles approaching on said roadway.
- Section 11. Vehicles Shall Not be Driven on the Sidewalk. The driver of a vehicle shall not drive within any sidewalk area.
- Section 12. Clinging to Hoving Vehicles. Any person riding upon any bicycle, motorcycle, coaster, sled, roller-skates, or any toy vehicle, shall not attach the same, or himself, to any public conveyance, or moving vehicle upon any rogdway.

ORDINANCE

BE IT THEREFORE ORDAINED, that it shall be unlawful for any driver, or operator of any motor vehicle to intentionally and without cause drive or in any other manner operate any motor vehicle within the Municipal limits of the Town of Creswell, in such a manner as to cause the vehicle to spin and rotate rapidly creating loud or excessive squealing or screeching of the powered driven tires. A term commonly known as 'scratching off'.

A violation of this Ordinance shall be a misdemeanor and this Ordinance shall be effective from and after date of its adoption.

Section 13. <u>Midin on Handle-Bars Prohibited</u>. The operator of motoryele, or bicycle, when upon a street, shall not carry any person upon the handle-Lir, firme, or tank of any such webtele, nor shall any person so ride upon any such rehicle.

Section 14. Fiding on Sidewalks, or lithout Bands on Bandlebarr, Prohibited. To person shall side a bicycle or motorcycle on any others without beyone bis bands upon the handlebars, nor shall any person ride a bicycle upon any sidewalk or wallway within the Tour.

Section 15. Use of Coaster, Boller-Skates, and Similar Devices Restricted. To person upon roller-skater, or riding in, or by means of, any coaster, toy-vehicle, or similar device, shall go upon an roadway, unless it be while crossing a street at a crosswalk or intersection; except upon streets set aside as play streets.

Section LJ. <u>Lights on Parked Vehicles</u>. The displaying of lights upon a vehicle, when lowfully parked at night upon a street of the Town in accordance with this Article, shall not be required when there is sufficient light to reveal any person with a distance of 200 feat upon such street.

Section 17. <u>Noving Cars from Parked Positions</u>. Cars parked shall move out in the direction headed, or if they are parked at an angle with the curb they shall back out on that angle until they have cleared the other cars and shall then proceed in the direction they are most nearly headed in.

Section 18. Speed-Limit. A vehicle may be operated on any street of the Toyn, designated elsewhere in this Article as a business section, at a rate of speed not exceeding twenty miles per hour, provided, however, that at no time shall the speed be greater than is reasonable and prudent under the conditions then existing. The speed limit on state highways in residential sections shall be 35 miles per hour and 25 miles per hour on all other streets.

Section 19. Driving on Roadways Laned for Traffic. All vehicles operated on any roadway which has been clearly marked with lanes for traffic, shall be driven as nearly as practical entirely within a single lane and shall not be moved from such lane until the driver has first ascertained that such movement can be made with safety.

Section 20. Driving over Fire-Hose. We wehicle shall be driven over any hose of the fire department when laid down on any street, or driveway, to be used at any fire, without the consent of the fire department official in command.

ARTICLE VI-- ISCELLAMEOUS REGULATIONS

Section 1. Boarding, or Alighting From, Public Conveyances or Other V hicles. No person shall beard, or alight from, any public conveyance, or



other vehicle, while such conveyance, or vehicle, is in motion.

- Section 2. Unlowful Miding. No person chall ride on any public conveyance, or vehicle, or any portion the eof, not designed, or intended, for the use of cassengers. This provision shall not apply to an employee or aged in the necessary discharge of a duty, or to persons riding within truck bodies in spaces intended for nerchandise.
- Section 3. Entering, Jumping Cn, or Miding Vehicles Without Permission. No person shall enter, jump on, or ride any automobile, or other vehicle, without the consent of the owner or driver.
- Section 4. Persons Ridin; Must Stay Inside. We person when ridin; shall allow any part of his body to protrude beyond the limits of the vehicle in which he is riding, except to give such simuls as are by law required, and no person shall hang on to any vehicle what soever.
- Section 5. Not More than Three Persons Permitted in Front Seat. It shall be unlawful for the driver, or the person in charge, of any motor vehicle to permit more than three persons (including driver) to ride in the front, or driver's seat of a motor vehicle.

CHAPTER K--PETALMIES

Section 1. Any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions of any section or subsection of this Ordinance, or failing or neglecting or refusing to comply with same, shall, upon conviction, be quilty of a misdemeanor and subject to a fine not to exceed fifty dollars (550.00) or imprisonment not to exceed thirty (30) days, and each day that any of the provisions of this Ordinance are violated shall constitute a separate offense.

That all of the foregoing chapters, sub-chapters, articles, sections, sub-sections, sub-divisions and paragraphs, shall be and are hereby duly made, ratified, and adopted as the "Code of Ordinances of the Town of Creswell, Morth Carolina." And all ordinances, o her then franchises, specific contracts or ordinances issuing, approving, or ratifying or concerning the floating, issuing or sale of bonds for various municipal purposes, ordinances relating to the extension of corporate limits, revenue ordinances or ordinances establishing permanent street improvement districts, or concerning the extension, grade, widening, laying out, naming and/or establishing of new streets or ordinances concerning bridges, subways and under-passes, or condemnation proceedings, that are in conflict or not in conformity herewith, are amended so as to conform thereto; what is known as the Annual Revenue Ordinances is not included in this Code and no part of said Revenue Ordinance is repealed by anything contained in this Code; ordinances of a constructual nature now in effect unless in conflict with, or contrary to, provisions of this Code are not hereby repealed or altered; and ordinances allowing, permitting, approving or confirming sales of lands or the conveyance of land by or to the Town are not hereby altered, amended, or repealed; nor shall any contract with the Government of the United States or any agencies thereto be construed to be altered, amended, or repealed; nor shall any contract or agreement with the Health Department of the County of Washington, or any of the various departments thereof, including agreements as to use of tax assessment books, or the levying, or assessing of said tax be construed to be altered, amended or repealed; but all other ordinances of a penal nature if not included in said Code are hereby repealed.

Provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall be construed to extend the time in or for which any franchises, contracts, or privilege was granted by the Town, nor to enlarge any right or rights given or granted in any franchises, contracts or privileges granted, or made by the Town nor to annul or abridge any right of privilege heretofore given, or granted to the Town

And it is also ordained that this Code may be referred to as the "Code of the Town of Creswell, North Carolina, 1967". And in all judicial proceedings it shall be sufficient to blead any ordinance or section of said Code by the caption or by the number of the section thereof; and it hall not be necessary to plead the entire ordinance or section, and a comy of said Code, when introduced in any of the courts of the State, shall be taken as prima facie evidence of the existence of any ordinance contained therein.
